A Personal Message Of Thanks From Me

The planning for Operation Stocking Stuffer 2017 began in the summer of last year when members of the Houston Fire Department and KPRC Channel 2 sat down to discuss the logistics of the campaign. Dates and other details were finalized as we began preparation for one of the largest community outreach programs in the City. Little did we know that in August a massive, soaking-wet curve ball was going to be thrown at us that could change all of our plans and severely hamper Houston's largest toy drive. That curve ball of course was Hurricane Harvey.

I have seen the devastation first-hand. Living near the Addicks Reservoir, my neighborhood was absolutely ravaged by flood waters. My wife and I were one of the lucky ones. Our home was one of 300 in a neighborhood of almost 2000 homes that didn't flood. I had waterfront property complete with a boat launch which just happened to be my driveway. People are still recovering as the endless piles of debris stacked up on the brown front lawns never seem to disappear. I have lived through many of these storms and have never seen destruction like this.

All of this raised some profound questions. How do you plan an event like Operation Stocking Stuffer in the midst of all this chaos? How much can people continue to donate? What numbers do we expect and what do we need to plan for? With all of the relief efforts, money being donated and supplies and support coming in from all over the world, just what is going to happen to the toy drive? One thing was clear however, there were going to be more people in need than ever before. We just didn't know what to expect.

Well as usual, all of our questions were answered when the incredibly generous citizens of this great City came together and donated a record number of toys and money to our effort- and they were not the only ones coming to the rescue. Companies and organizations from California to New Jersey donated palettes of toys and money to help Houston area families have a brighter holiday season. California-based Sempra Energy donated \$10,000 and their Community Outreach Director flew in to shop with their local employees using the money they gave. Mark and Barbara Nowakowski spearheaded a campaign in New Jersey and New York to collect toys for

the toy drive and ADG Creative did the same in Columbia, Maryland, a suburb of Baltimore. They shipped pallets of toys to our warehouse and more toys came in from Chicago and cash and checks came in from here and there which helped us reached a record number of financial contributions.

We had many established local companies join us for the first time in 2017 because they saw the need. Way Engineering, the Albemarle Foundation, BMC Software, Zermat USA and Doggett Heavy Machinery Services are just a few of the new elves in Santa's workshop. Long time toy drive contributors really stepped up to deliver a record amount of toys. KBR and Latham and Watkins LLP continued to amaze with the amount of toys they donated while Shell Oil hosted an employee build-a-bike day at their head-quarters in West Houston and other locations. They built over 600 bikes to donate to the toy drive and then had them delivered to the distribution location. We of course ended up with a record number of bikes too. Fund raisers were hosted all over town to collect toys including two firsts for Operation Stocking Stuffer- a fashion show and a disc golf tournament. These are just a few examples of the generous spirit that brings us all together in times of need.

In fact, so many donations were received we unfortunately were not able to pick them all up before the giveaway on December 21, due to limited personnel. HFD fire stations continued to call in to report they had toys even into the second week of January. But not to worry, all of the toys and gifts will get to those who need them. We are working with several

Houston area non-profit organizations and churches to make sure that happens.

So on behalf of everyone at the Houston Fire Department and all of those families who you helped to have a Merry Christmas, I want to thank you from the bottom of my heart. All of you are what make this event such a success and never forget that.

or many years the great folks at PODS of Houston have donated PODS containers and all of the pick-up and delivery service to Operation Stocking Stuffer. Even after Hurricane Harvey when their inventory was severely depleted, Tim Preston and Larry Sledge with PODS asked what they could do to once again be a part of this massive community outreach effort.

Every year PODS containers are placed at selected HFD fire stations based on the involvement of the surrounding community. If a station receives an abundance of toy donations each year a PODS container will be placed at their station if possible to store the toys. The containers act as satellite warehouses (think of them as "Santa's Toy Boxes") to allow the firefighters to save driving time as they make their pick-ups. Houston is a city of over 620 square miles with over 90 participating fire stations and with a limited amount of personnel able to pick up all of these donations, saving driving time is essential to the success of the campaign.

With the devastation brought by Harvey, Houstonians called upon PODS of Houston to provide secure storage options as they began to rebuild their homes and lives. This put a great strain on the inventory at the PODS warehouse but with a little logistical problem solving, PODS of Houston was still able to provide 21 containers for Operation Stocking Stuffer that allowed for another year of record numbers of families and children served in time for the holidays.

Larry, Tim, all of the drivers and everyone at PODS on the local and national level, the members of the Houston Fire Department would like to express our deepest thanks to you for your incredible efforts as a part of Operation Stocking Stuffer. We truly could not do what we do without you.

November 30, 2017- Huge Announcement from Hess




